Union for Mediterranean (UfM) overview

The Union for the Mediterranean (UfM (UfM; French: Union pour la Méditerranée, Arabic: الإتحاد من أجل المتوسط Al-Ittiḥād min ajl al-Mutawassaṭ) is an intergovernmental Euro-Mediterranean organization which brings 27 EU member states, 15 Southern Mediterranean countries are members of the UfM: Albania, Algeria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Mauritania, Monaco, Montenegro, Morocco, Palestine, Syria (suspended), Tunisia and Turkey. Libya is an observer.

European countries classification in taking into account ones that on Mediterranean shore such as Croatia, Cyprus, France, Greece, Italy, Malta, Slovenia and Spain.







The UfM's goal is to enhance regional cooperation, dialogue and the implementation of concrete projects and initiatives with tangible impact on our citizens.

Three are the pillar of Union of Mediterranean activities: Human Development, Integration and Stability.

History

It was founded on 13 July 2008 at the Paris Summit for the Mediterranean, with an aim of reinforcing the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership (Euromed) that was set up in 1995 as the Barcelona Process. Its general secretariat is located in Barcelona, Spain.


Step by step

1995 Launch of the Barcelona Process with the aim to strengthen relations between Europe and the Southern Mediterranean countries, in the framework of an enhanced Euro-Mediterranean association that contributes to achieve peace and security in the region.

2008 Launch of the Union for the Mediterranean. The Union for the Mediterranean was launched by a decision of the UfM Heads of State and Government in Paris in July 2008.

Union for Mediterranean Institutions



The governance of the UfM is based on co-decision and shared responsibility between the two shores of the Mediterranean and is structured to promote interactions among Member States.

Co-Presidency

The governance of the Union for the Mediterranean is established through a process designed to ensure co-ownership of the decisions and shared responsibility by the Northern and Southern Mediterranean countries. The UfM is chaired by a copresidency shared between the two shores.

Senior officials' Meeting (SOM)

The members of the Union for the Mediterranean meet on a regular basis at the level of Senior Officials from the Ministries of Foreign Affairs of the 42 UfM countries, EU institutions and the League of Arab States. The Senior Officials Meetings (SOM) provide the framework to discuss the current political context and coordinate the work of the UfM Secretariat. They approve the budget and work programme of the Secretariat and set the basis to prepare the Ministerial Meetings. They also discuss the project proposals submitted for approval and endorsement. The Senior Officials take decisions by consensus.

Secretariat

Based in Barcelona, the UfM Secretariat is the platform to operationalise decisions taken by Member States, through the preparation of Ministerial meetings, the facilitation of regional dialogue platforms and the development of strategic regional projects. The UfM Secretariat operates under the direction of the Secretary General, supported by six Deputy Secretary Generals (DSGs), each in charge of a sectorial division: Business Development and Employment, Social & Civil Affairs, Higher Education & Research, Water & Environment, Transport & Urban Development and Energy & Climate Action.





Union for Mediterranean Institutions



The Secretary General and the DSGs are appointed by the Member States for a threeyears term, renewable once. Three DSGs are nominated by EU countries and three by Southern and Eastern countries.

The UfM Secretariat team consists of more than 60 international staff members from over 20 countries, including diplomatic and technical personnel seconded by Member States and partner institutions such as the European Commission, the European Investment Bank (EIB) and France's Caisse des Dépôts.

Exports of goods as a percentage of GDP, 1972-2018



Average trade facilitation performance, Union of Mediterranean countries and subregions




Note: Average performance based on eleven trade facilitation indicators. Each indicator take values from 0 to 2 (best performance). Variables in the TFI dataset are coded with 0, 1, or 2. These seek to reflect not only the regulatory framework in the concerned countries but, to the extent possible, the state of implementation of various trade facilitation measures. Mauritania and the Palestinian Authority are not covered by the TFI dataset.

Most of the UfM countries are relatively similar about 11 indicators that are showing average trade facilitator performance. Indicators are related to documentation requirements related to harmonization, cooperation with neighbouring and third countries, automation of necessary trade formalities, governance and impartiality, fee and charges, advance ruling, procedures.
